

**CITY OF OJAI
RESOLUTION NO. 17-42
A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OJAI
ADOPTING THE PROPOSED BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR
2017-2018**

WHEREAS, the City Manager has prepared and presented to the City Council of the City of Ojai the proposed budget for fiscal year 2017-2018 during its meetings on May 23, June 6, and June 13, 2017, at a public hearing which was continued from June 13, to June 27, 2017, and an additional public hearing held on October 10, 2017. An updated budget document was distributed to the members of City Council and the public to review on October 6, 2017; and

WHEREAS, After providing notice and holding a public hearing to solicit and receive public comments on said budgets and all persons were given an opportunity to be heard and their suggestions were considered at the October 10, 2017 regular City Council meeting; and

WHEREAS, the City Council acknowledges its interest in enabling the City Manager to conduct City business in the most efficient and effective manner possible; and

WHEREAS, all necessary changes and modifications shall be made to said budgets, as directed by the City Council during its meetings on May 23, June 6, June 13, June 27, and October 10, 2017; and

WHEREAS, Government Code Section 66001 requires that a local agency make findings once each fiscal year with respect to unexpended development impact fees held for five years or more; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Ojai that:

SECTION 1. The City Council has studied these budgets at length and finds that the budgets are a sound plan for financing and expenditure control necessary to municipal operations and capital improvements, and the budgets are hereby adopted as amended during its regular meeting on October 10, 2017. The Fiscal Year 2017-18 Capital Improvements Budget with the final modifications was previously adopted on June 27, 2017.

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SECTION 2. The City Council is aware of the potential that events beyond the control of the City Council could substantially reduce City revenues and/or increase expenditures. Therefore, the City Manager may temporarily suspend the expenditure of funds in the adopted budget if, in the City Manager's judgment, such deferral is necessary to protect the City's Financial position and the impact of such a temporary suspension on City operations will not be substantially detrimental to City services.

SECTION 3. The City Manager is further directed to report back to the Council, on a quarterly basis, with recommendations for revision of the budget when, and if, budget impacts are known and recommended City program adjustments can be formulated.

SECTION 4. The City Council hereby authorizes the City Manager to sign and execute any professional or consulting service contracts on behalf of the City, provided that the service has been approved as a part of the adopted budget.

SECTION 5. The City budget analysis shows impact fees collected by the City since 1991, some of which the City will hold for more than five years. Pursuant to State law, the Council hereby finds that the monies collected are necessary to carry out the purpose for which the impact fees were levied and the improvements to be so financed as identified by the City's Engineer will benefit the properties where development was approved.

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
