RESOLUTION NO. 17-35
A CONTINUING RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OJAI
CONTINUING THE PROPOSED BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR
2017-2018

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to continue the existing fiscal year 2016-17 budget, to enable additional time to consider amendments to the proposed fiscal year 2017-18 budget, and intends that the City Manager will return with a revised proposed fiscal year 2017-18 budget on or before the first Council Meeting in October of, 2017; and

WHEREAS, After providing notice and holding a public hearing to solicit and receive public comments on said proposed continuing resolution and all persons were given an opportunity to be heard and their suggestions were considered at the June 27, 2017 regular City Council meeting; and

WHEREAS, the City Council acknowledges its interest in enabling the City Manager to conduct City business in the most efficient and effective manner possible; and

WHEREAS, Government Code Section 66001 requires that a local agency make findings once each fiscal year with respect to unexpended development impact fees held for five years or more; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Ojai that:

SECTION 1. The City Council hereby adopts a continuing resolution directing the continued implementation of the fiscal year 2016-17 budget for the fiscal year 2017-18 period, until further action by the Council. The City Council additionally hereby adopts the fiscal year 2017-18 Capital Improvement Projects budget, including Funds 31 and 33, as presented to the City Council on June 27, 2017 and directs that the City Manager implement it. The City Council further directs the continued funding of the fiscal year 2016-17 Community Outreach Programs at prorated fiscal year 2016-17 funding levels for an additional three months at the beginning of fiscal year 2017-18.

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
SECTION 2. The City Council is aware of the potential that events beyond the control of the City Council could substantially reduce City revenues and/or increase expenditures. Therefore, the City Manager may temporarily suspend the expenditure of funds in the adopted budget if, in the City Manager's judgment, such deferral is necessary to protect the City's Financial position and the impact of such a temporary suspension on City operations will not be substantially detrimental to City services.

SECTION 3. The City Manager is further directed to report back to the Council, on or before the first meeting in October of 2017 and on a quarterly basis, with recommendations for revision of the budget when, and if, budget impacts are known and recommended City program adjustments can be formulated.

SECTION 4. The City Council hereby authorizes the City Manager to sign and execute any professional or consulting service contracts on behalf of the City, provided that the service has been approved as a part of the adopted budget.

SECTION 5. The City budget analysis shows impact fees collected by the City since 1991, some of which the City will hold for more than five years. Pursuant to State law, the Council hereby finds that the monies collected are necessary to carry out the purpose for which the impact fees were levied and the improvements to be so financed as identified by the City's Engineer will benefit the properties where development was approved.
